High School Core Classes

English / Speech

Students will embark on an enriching journey of American Literature with additional focus on Fantasy Literature. The literature selections provide a platform for investigations into the importance of family, virtue, Christian/Gospel principles, integrity and courage and allow students to become acquainted with outstanding authors of these genres. Students will explore a variety of literary devices and writing styles encouraging them to find their own voice and experience the joy found in sharing it! The class will engage in discussions through the exploration of captivating lessons, novels, short stories and poetry.

This course focuses on developing student's skills and strategies for critical, independent reading and writing of expository, narrative, response to literature, and persuasive texts. Through the literature topics, students will gain confidence as they articulate their own ideas as well as analyze, interpret, and evaluate the readings. The goal of this course is to support students becoming independent, strategic, critical readers, writers, listeners, and speakers who communicate effectively and authentically.



Instructor: Stacey Lytle is an award-winning author, speaker, facilitator, educator, coach, and mentor. Stacey is the Legacy Leadership Academy Director; she delights in teaching youth and is a passionate English Instructor. Stacey has founded several schools and inspired many with her vision for education. Math

High School classes will have the option of teacher-led Instruction in CTC Algebra or Self-paced with mentor assistance; students may bring their own math curriculum or use CTC as the school-provided option. Karen McKenzie is Legacy's Math Specialist. She mentors students at all math levels and helps students set and achieve their personal math goals. She brings passion, dedication, and a love of math to all her teaching.

teaching any math through Calculus. I studied at BYU-Idaho, Boise State, and finally earned my math degree from Indiana University - East. Since then, I've been dedicated to creating a supportive and engaging environment where my students feel empowered to tackle math challenges head-on. I will be teaching and mentoring 8th-12th grade students.

Science

The High School course for the 2023/2024 school year is Physical Science/Conceptual Physics - this creation-based science introduces students to physical science through engaging lessons and experiments that give students the opportunity for even deeper learning. This course covers atomic structure, the periodic table, chemical bonds, reactions, motion, forces, energy, waves, sound, light, electricity, magnetism, Earth's structure, weathering, and atmosphere.

History

Modern World History – This exciting course begins with an overview of the history of the Ottoman Empire and the emergence of the Renaissance. Students will then learn about the Age of Exploration and colonization, and the Scientific Revolution. Students will enjoy learning some of the most fascinating aspects of the modern histories of China, India, Korea, Japan, Iran and Russia. Special emphasis will be given to the Reformation, and its relation to the restoration of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Students will then dive into learning about the American and French Revolutions, the Atlantic slave trade, the

Napoleonic Wars and the Industrial Revolution. Both World Wars will be covered, followed by the division of Korea, the Arab-Israeli conflict, the Cold War, the Information Age and Post-Colonial Africa.

Note from Instructor: We will be studying World History this year at Legacy. It is a broad and challenging task, but my goal is to learn and discuss important moments in history that will give the students a better cohesive idea of why the world is the way it is today. I want the students to leave this class with the understanding that they are creating their own history and they need to think about their own personal decisions and the consequences that follow. An integral part of who we become is based on the experiences we have on this earth. I want the students to question: Who is it that I want to become? What people in history should I look up to and why? How can I emulate those that I look up to so I can be my best self? There are so many books, documents, videos to read/cover and I want the students to walk away being able to think for themselves. We can not cover it all in this class and that is okay! I want to inspire the students to ask questions and be able to find reputable sources to answer those questions. Sadly, so much of history has been distorted over the years and I want to encourage the students to listen to the Spirit about what is true. Finally, I want my students to walk away from this class inspired to learn about the world and people of the past so they can have a greater knowledge of the world today and how everything affects the future.

Life Skills Unleashed!



A course taught by Stacey Lytle for High School Students on Monday afternoons.

When Life Skills & Leadership Collide ... Amazing things happen!!! Think of this class, if you will, as a "Life Skills Bootcamp" – A Training for life's essential skills ... A Class where fun is a priority and hard work is essential!

This course covers a broad array of topics designed to prepare high school students to be wise, joyful managers of their lives. Students will learn principles and strategies for prioritizing values and goals, along with effective time management, problem solving

and decision making techniques. Students will learn to connect their personal mission with a servant-leader approach to life. They will gain an understanding of how to develop a vision for anticipated projects and initiatives. Students will learn to use some key leadership tools and techniques, including how to engage others in a good cause, effective communication, cultivating and nurturing relationships, and conducting events. They will receive guidance regarding establishing and maintaining healthy

relationships, including interpersonal and communication skills. Instruction will cover techniques of good house cleaning, food preparation and basic cooking. The course includes an overview of home and auto maintenance. Students will gain an understanding of how to manage housing and transportation needs, and how to prepare to handle a variety of emergencies. The lessons encourage students to seek guidance from the Holy Spirit and from their parents.

Middle School Core Classes

Middle School classes will have a homeroom teacher that will lead devotional time each morning. In addition to devotional, specified homeroom time has been allocated into the schedule for memorization of the *Family Proclamation* and additional language arts time, as needed. First semester, students will engage in Leadership and Life/Social Skills classes with the bonus of Middle School Movement, a fun, energetic time for students to work alongside one another. Second semester, students will participate in an Entrepreneurial Class with the culminating project being the Legacy Academy Business Fair.

Please note language arts, history, and geography will be taught together in the Middle School homeroom.

Language Arts

This course is a rich and thrilling adventure through some of the finest selections of American and British literature. Students will enjoy engaging lessons, novels, short stories and poetry. The literature selections provide a platform for investigations into the importance of family, virtue, Christian/Gospel principles, integrity and courage and allow students to become acquainted with some outstanding authors of these genres, as well as literary themes, symbolism, plot-lines, characters, settings, writing styles, etc.

Students will engage in developing expository writing; explore the concepts of theme, audience, and paragraph structure. Students will also refine their skills in persuasive writing, and how to expand their creativity through writing poetry and the art of the fairy tale. Language arts comprehension and skills are strengthened by studying Latin and Greek roots, and through proper use of MLA formatting. Students will also sharpen their skills through fun games and activities designed to teach grammar and capitalization.

History and Geography

Students will be invited to see the hand of God in the story of His children through World History and World Geography. This course will take students on an exciting and fascinating journey from pre-history to the present day. Learn about the beginnings of civilization, the brilliant innovations of the Mesopotamians,

the ancient and mighty Egyptians, the dramatic history of the ancient Hebrews, the important contributions of the ancient Greeks, and the powerful early civilizations of India and China. Explore the Roman Republic and how it became the mighty Roman Empire. Discover parts to the story of early Christianity you may not have previously heard. Find out about the influence of the Byzantine Empire and the culture of Islamic civilizations during the Middle Ages. Learn about Imperial China, the great African Empires and Feudal Japan. Students will discover Meso-American and Andean Civilizations, learn about the Medieval, Renaissance and Reformation eras in Europe, and the Age of Exploration. Find out about the Colonization of Africa, the Scientific Revolution, and the Enlightenment. Understand Latin American Colonization and Independence Movements. Study Canadian and Australian History. Learn about the great progress and struggles of the Industrial Revolution. Understand the causes, belligerents, conflicts and results of the World Wars. Discover how life changed as a result of the Information Age and Globalization.

In the study of Geography, students will "take a trip" around the world, as they learn about the continents, oceans, mountain ranges, major rivers and largest lakes. Explore the Arctic and learn the geography of Canada and Mexico. Learn some new geography terms. Find out about the land, countries and peoples of Central America, the Caribbean, South America and Europe. They will also take a journey through the countries of Asia, the Middle East, Africa, Australia and the South Pacific. Visit the world's largest cities. Learn about Antarctica, and the world's major deserts, temperate forests, tropical rain forests, grasslands, tundra and taiga.

7th Grade - Apologia's General Science is the course of instruction for 7th Grade Science. This course is designed to be a student's first systematic introduction to the sciences. Students will explore broad topics such as the scientific method, designing experiments, simple machines, geology, archaeology, biology, and more, with a large focus on Earth Science (astronomy, meteorology, oceanography, earth study, geology, paleontology, and environmental science). Hands-on experiments offer practical experience as they discover the principles behind science and learn how to record and report data. Students will learn to see God's hand in all of creation.

Leadership / Life & Social Skills with Middle School Movement!

A course taught by Stephanie Hoyt and Laura Wheeler for Middle School Students on Monday afternoons. Good social skills are critical to successful functioning in life. These skills enable us to know what to say, how to make good choices, and how to behave in diverse situations. The extent to which children and adolescents possess good social skills can influence their academic performance, behavior, social and family relationships, and involvement in extracurricular activities. In this class, students will combine discussions with fun activities to assist them in learning social-emotional skills such as responsible decision-making, working together to solve problems, managing strong emotions, and getting along with others. These skills can help children succeed academically and socially.

The focus of this class will be on the *Principles of Leadership* along with *Survival skills* (e.g., listening, following directions, ignoring distractions, using nice or brave talk, rewarding yourself) *Interpersonal skills* (e.g., sharing, asking for permission, joining an activity, waiting your turn) *Problem-solving skills* (e.g., asking for help, apologizing, accepting consequences, deciding what to do) and *Conflict resolution skills* (e.g., dealing with teasing, losing, accusations, being left out, peer pressure).

Please note: When enrolling in a course, students are committing for the semester or the year. Students may pay upfront for the course and receive a small discount.

Students may attend 2-days a week in either Middle School or High School. A-la-carte classes are high school only, except for electives, which are combined with middle & high school students.

Note about credit & funding

Students may earn high school credit for classes by co-enrolling in distance learning programs such as Overture, Tech Trep, or Harmony and submitting course requirements. The funding families receive through these programs generally does not qualify for tuition because of the religious component to classes, but it can be used to off-set books and curriculum costs and outside educational activities (e.g. music lessons, sports, computer purchases).

High School Students wishing to work toward credits for their Associate Degree may opt out of courses and complete work onsite.
